1 Call to Order

8 Town Update

9 2nd Draft of 2020 Town Budget

10 Mr. Sterndale discussed the town meeting warrant articles for 2020 and estimated tax impact.

11 Two citizen petition articles have been received: SB2 for the town and North River Lake Road to

be accepted as a town road. Mr. Sterndale went over the revenue sources for the town. Because

13 of the revenues, much of the increases to the budget are offset by the revenues. The estimated tax

14 increase is 0.69%. The estimated town budget for 2020 is \$2,739,736. Mr. Dabrieo asked if they

15 will see a breakdown of the revenues including decreases in revenue; Mr. Sterndale said yes. The

additional revenue for the recreation department goes to the rec revolving fund.

Mr. Koester asked about town clerk fees. Mr. Sterndale said by statute the town clerk earns a 17 portion of the fees she collects. Mr. Sterndale said they offered a second health insurance plan 18 and 1/3 of the employees took this option. This saved the town approximately \$20K. Ms. Martin 19 asked if they budgeted back-end payments for the deductibles that the town is paying for the 20 employees; Mr. Sterndale said yes. Mr. Sterndale said that Brian Spagna is retiring from the 21 police department; they will save money when they hire someone at a lower cost. Highway 22 projects, community center boiler, and equipment projects were purchased with 2019 money and 23 taken out of the 2020 budget. Ms. Martin asked about kitchen remodel. Mr. Sterndale said they 24 don't have funds budgeted at this time but the BOS may look at that again. Heating maintenance 25 costs in the budget can be reduced due to the new boiler. Mr. Bartlett asked about the old town 26 27 hall. Mr. Sterndale said that the electrical work will be done for very low cost by Tiler Eaton and workers he procured. Ms. Jones asked about recycling revenue. Mr. Sterndale said they sell all 28 plastics, metals, cans, and cardboard. Paper used to be sold; they pay to get rid of it now. The 29 30 town pays to get rid of electronics. Mr. Sterndale said they have not decided if they will split Ledge Farm Road paving into one or two projects. There was some further discussion about 31 Ledge Farm Road and other road projects. Mr. Sterndale said there were safety concerns on the 32 33 sharp corner on Ledge Farm Road which is why they started paving with that end of the road in 34 2019. Mr. Koester asked if Shawn could come speak to the BC meeting. Mr. Dabrieo asked Mr. 35 Sterndale about recycling education. Mr. Sterndale said people do a great job with recycling. Mr. Decker said anything that is not 1 or 2 plastic, people can put it in bulky waste. Ms. Jones said as 36

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long as there is an environmental benefit to recycling, it is worth doing it. There was discussion
on inviting library and recreation to an upcoming meeting and it was determined that they didn't
need to come.

40 *Other Town Updates*

41 Jack Myers has left highway department. Mr. Leveille asked how roads are graded. Mr. Bartlett

42 said ideally it is scheduled but there has been some personnel issues over the summer. Shawn

43 McLean, Public Works Director, is hiring new personnel and they need to learn the roads. The

44 roads are not being graded now as they are frozen.

45 School Update

46 Dr. Chavda said they have hired a part time Business Administrator as of yesterday. They are

47 hoping to have audited financials soon. The School Board went over the budget yesterday; one

48 change was made which was an error. They are adding a warrant article for a study to remove the

49 Nottingham school district from the SAU. The citizens of Strafford have to vote in March to

50 leave the SAU and the state has to agree. Strafford has left the preschool already. Mr. Koester

51 said that the school board will have the architect at a town forum to go over the proposed

addition. The School Board's goal is to have the forum before the Deliberative Session. Dr.

53 Chavda said the School Board is continuing to work on the budget and reduce items where they

can. Mr. Koester said the warrant article deadline for the school is tomorrow. Dr. Chavda said

they have applied for a waiver for the school building aid through the state. Mr. Koester when

the state evaluates an application for School Building Aid, they consider prior aid for that school

57 over the past 50 years, and reduce the qualifying square footage of the current project

accordingly. The waivers Dr. Chavda spoke of were to request that the additions to the school's
former location (now the community center) not be considered. Mr. Koester asked Dr. Chavda if

former location (now the community center) not be considered. Mr. Koester asked Dr. Chavda ifthere were any other towns that would be interested in joining our SAU. Dr. Chavda said one

town approached Nottingham in the past but it was too far away and too different than

62 Nottingham. Teacher contract is almost done being negotiated. Mr. Leveille asked about online

learning for snow days. Dr. Chavda said that not all students have access to high speed internet

64 due to the infrastructure of the town. Dr. Chavda will speak to the School Board about this
