Mr. Sterndale said one of the parcels that is up for tax deeding is making efforts to pay back taxes. The other is not.

Mr. Morin said he believes that they don't take a house that is a primary residence. There are multiple liens on the house in question.

Mr. Sterndale said the parcel on Rte. 202 is under contract to be sold.

E-911

Mr. Morin said he has had conversations with people about E-911. He thinks the BOS will get some backlash on it but people will be respectful. Mr. Sterndale said there will be a public hearing. It may be at the school because of size.

Ms. Danis confirmed that the BOS makes the decision to have a public hearing on this issue. Mr. Sterndale said the fire chief doesn't believe the difficulties are worth the change. Mr. Dumas said the ultimate benefit will be better than the brief inconvenience. He would be interested in having the public hearing. Mr. Sterndale said that 90% of people's road numbers will change. Mr. Morin asked if they can get sued if they don't do this. Mr. Sterndale said no. Mr. Sterndale said that there are some roads that are particularly egregious, and they could just do those instead. Ms. Danis said they could just fix the worst problems. Ms. Danis said she is concerned about moving forward if they don't have the chief's buy-in.

The BOS agreed they would move forward on a smaller scale from E-911.
