- 9 The Chair opened the meeting at 6:30pm with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mr. Bartlett said
- 10 Nottingham Police, Nottingham Fire, Raymond Ambulance Corp and Lorraine Petrini did a great
- job for the Recycled Percussion event. Raymond Ambulance volunteered services and police had
- 12 no incidences.

- 17 Both items were pushed off.
- 18 *CIP*
- 19 No update.
- 20 *300th Celebration Committee*
- 21 There was a meeting last week. A bonfire, Earth Day, and program books were all discussed. \$7k
- has been raised. Picnic at Pawtuckaway and reenactment will also be planned.
- The 300th Celebration Committee will meet with the BOS soon. Mr. Sterndale said no one has
- talked to the Highway Dept. about using the pit for a bonfire.
- 25 Marston Property
- Ms. Danis said Matt Kouchoukos has looked at back stops and side fences.
- 27 Town Administrator Report
- There were bid results for the fire dept. mezzanine. The Board concurred going with the low
- 29 bidder.
- 30 Mr. Eaton made a motion for the BOS to approve the lower bid for the Fire Dept.
- 31 mezzanine project. Ms. Danis seconded. Unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.

- 32 Mr. Sterndale said someone is interested in leasing the landfill area for a solar power system. The
- 33 Board concurred that Mr. Sterndale will look into this.

- 42 Road Standards Policy
- 43 Mr. Bartlett said there will be a 25-minute discussion from the public with 3 minutes given for
- each person.
- 45 Mr. Dearborn suggested the BOS follow the will of the people and rescind the road standards
- policy as was voted on in Article 20. He said the Board should reaffirm and rescind the policy
- 47 immediately. He said the Board could reintroduce new standards or the same standards.
- 48 Mr. Bartlett said Judy and Kip was unable to come to the meeting. He read their statement out
- 49 loud. In the letter, it noted that most of the roads in Nottingham would not pass the standards.
- They are in favor of rescinding the road standards policy as voted on in Article 20.
- Ms. Kelley asked if the Board plans to apply these standards to Mooers Road. Mr. Bartlett said at
- 52 the time Mooers Road was approved, there were no road standards. Ms. Danis said everyone
- thinks that every road is going to be immediately brought up to those standards. There is room
- 54 for judgment for roads in those standards.
- Ms. Kelley said the town administrator urged the BOS to pass the road standards. She said it was
- 56 passed so quickly because Article 19 was coming up. She thinks those road standards were not
- 57 suitable or relevant to Nottingham. She said if they need them, she thinks they should be more
- relevant to Nottingham. She said that if the road standards are aspirational, they should be more
- realistic for the town of Nottingham.
- 60 Mr. Bartlett closed the public discussion.
- Ms. Danis said they are as a Board didn't come up with those standards quickly. They were not
- developed in haste. Mr. Dumas said they didn't pass the policy because of Article 19. He said the
- road standards were created over a year. Mr. Morin said he would like to take 8 things off the
- 64 road standards policy and he is not in favor of having road standards. Mr. Eaton said this is what

- 65 the people voted for but the roads were voted on and approved as is. These roads don't have to
- be paved right away or ever.
- 67 Mr. Bartlett said they have gone 300 years without road standards. The highway dept. needs to
- 68 go by something when they repair these roads. Mr. Bartlett said they spent a great deal of time
- 69 figuring out a standard. It could be this standard or something else. He believes this Board has an
- obligation to create something that can be used for future Boards. He said they could rescind the
- standards and then reinstate the same policy; however, that accomplishes nothing.
- Mr. Morin said he is not sure if the standards would be the same. He said some of these
- standards are unfeasible. Shawn McLean should know the best practices for the town and faith
- should be put in him to do his job well. Mr. Morin doesn't want these standards to be a large tax
- dollar for residents. He said if we are not going to upgrade to these standards, what is the point of
- 76 having them.
- Mr. Bartlett said it gives something the highway dept. to strive for. Ms. Danis said it gives
- 78 engineers a blueprint for what the roads should be and informs residents what the town is striving
- 79 for. Mr. Dumas said Shawn's input was given for this document.
- Mr. Eaton said there are only 5 people that can vote on this. There were 610 residents that voted
- on Article 20. The roads have been here forever. He is in favor of continuing to do whatever they
- have done in the past for the roads that were approved in Article 19.
- Mr. Dumas said they are only looking at the roads in Article 19 instead of all roads; they should
- be looking at all roads in town.
- Mr. Eaton said he doesn't think they need road standards for the roads that have become town
- 86 roads in the last election.
- Ms. Danis said it's not just those roads; it's any roads in town when they undergo a repair.
- 88 Mr. Dumas said it's self-defeating to get rid of standards. It's bad precedent for BOS to give up
- 89 their statutory authority. Mr. Bartlett said it was the will of the people. There were 610 people
- 90 that voted for Article 19. Mr. Dumas said there are 6000 people in town. Mr. Bartlett said they
- 91 need a standard; perhaps it's not this standard. He said sidewalks are not needed for existing
- 92 roads, however, that is mentioned in the road standards policy. Ms. Danis asked if more people
- 93 voted for sidewalks, would the BOS do that?
- 94 Mr. Bartlett said any future warrant articles should be listed as advisory or policy driven. Mr.
- 95 Sterndale said they can't do that with petition warrant articles.
- 96 Mr. Morin made a motion to rescind minimum standards of the roads as determined by the
- 97 will of the people in 2021 election. Mr. Eaton seconded.
- 98 Mr. Dumas said over the course of the year, no proposals came in that were opposed to road
- 99 standards. It may not be a perfect fit for the whole time. No one has come forward to offer any
- ideas, guidance other than rescind and reenact later.

- Mr. Eaton said he wants this issue to go away; one way or the other.
- Mr. Bartlett said this is the hardest decision he has had to make but he believes that they need a
- 103 road standard.
- Motion passes by a vote of 3-2 with Mr. Dumas and Ms. Danis voting nay.
- Mr. Bartlett asked if there was enough support to reinstate the road standards. Ms. Danis said
- that was pointless.
- 107 The discussion is closed.
- Ms. Danis said the new roads are not linked to the roads that were approved at the last election.
- 109 Comments should come from people who live on all different roads.
- 110 Mr. Bartlett said they would work on road standards at a future meeting.
- 111 Appointments
- 112 SAU Transition Committee
- Ms. Levenson thanked the Board for the concert last night as well as Mr. Bartlett and Ms.
- Petrini. Mr. Bartlett said it could not have gone on without the support of the School Board as
- 115 well.
- 116 Ms. Levenson said the state approved the new SAU. They have looked at different spaces in
- town. Mr. Spearin said one of the options was rented out; they are down to 2 choices. One is a
- room at the community center or the old town hall building. Mr. Spearin said it's less expensive
- to fix the room in the community center but there is less space in the town hall. In the old town
- hall, there are more updates needed. They will have 4 staff, potentially 5. They would need a
- conference room for meetings. The old town hall building needs a new boiler, and there are rot
- issues under the floor and other areas. He wants to see if the BOS has other options as well or
- what they think about these options.
- Mr. Bartlett asked if they would have enough room in the community center. Ms. Ricker said it
- would be a conference table, not a conference room. Ms. Levenson said part-time superintendent
- would be in the office and other personnel may be in the school most of the time. They need a
- business function personnel as well.
- Mr. Bartlett said the space is limited in the community center. The rec is crammed in as is. He is
- in favor of the old town hall with some help from the town.
- Ms. Levenson asked how long the old town hall has been left empty. Mr. Sterndale said the SAU
- signed over the building and the land underneath it to the town once they got a new school. The
- town moved into the community center from the old town hall. Ms. Levenson said it was the
- school district, not the SAU.

- Ms. Levenson said the old town hall has parking, and it's good to have the buildings up to code.
- 135 Ms. Ricker said they need to come up with a plan soon. She asked what the timeframe is to bring
- that building up to code.
- Mr. Bartlett recommended that the 2nd floor of the old town hall remain closed. He thinks the
- work will take longer than when the new SAU needs a space.
- Ms. Danis asked how soon the walk-through could happen. Mr. Sterndale said it may be hard to
- find a contractor. Mr. Eaton suggested Gary Anderson. Ms. Danis asked if that's the preferred
- location over the community center. There was no consensus among the committee. Mr. Morin
- said if the SAU moves to community center, it doesn't allow the town to expand. He believes the
- school should be separate from the town.
- Ms. Ricker said the room in the community center gives them 900 square feet. The old town hall
- would have to be turned back to the town for events. Mr. Sterndale said he said that is what he
- thought the town would want to happen. Ms. Ricker said the back space at the old town hall is a
- smaller space than the community center room. Mr. Spearin said they could put a small office
- there and have open cubicles for the rest of the staff. The bathroom space is nonexistent
- currently, and they would have to walk through the community space to get to the bathroom. Mr.
- Bartlett said he is in favor of allowing the whole space for the school.
- 151 Ms. Danis said she agrees with Mr. Morin; if the school moves to the community center, it
- doesn't allow the town to expand. She suggests finding out the cost of old town hall updates.
- Ms. Levenson said they have an unassigned fund balance of \$50k. Mr. Bartlett said the Board
- isn't able to tell the school what the town would spend at this time. Mr. Eaton said the more
- people that are in that building, the more money it would bring into the town. He is in favor of
- having the school occupy the whole space.
- 157 Ms. Ricker asked if the town is expecting the school to pay rent.
- Mr. Eaton said the building will fall over if they don't do something about it. The fire escape is
- dangerous. Ms. Danis asked if they could invest money into the first floor and is there a risk to
- the building. Mr. Eaton said they would spend a fortune for the 2nd floor. Ms. Danis asked if
- there was a safety hazard. Mr. Sterndale said they haven't had professional eyes on it. The 2nd
- 162 floor has lack of egress and the windows go to close to the floor.
- Ms. Danis asked if they can take some of the big space but leave some for community space. Mr.
- Sterndale said it's all or nothing. The stage area is up for grabs. Mr. Spearin said that area isn't
- helpful to them. Ms. Levenson said they would have to be good neighbors with both spaces.
- Mr. Spearin said they could take the community center for a short time. They could have other
- options in the future. He said that they would do the upgrades for the community center. He is
- worried about the old town hall. He believes it would be well over \$200k to fix the old town hall.
- Mr. Bartlett said he would like a professional to look at the building.

- Mr. Morin said the plan was to keep the old town hall. He would be in favor of the SAU in the
- 171 community center if it wasn't forever.
- Ms. Danis asked if the line dancing could be done at the school. Ms. Levenson said it could
- potentially be done there. She said the construction company may be able to look at the old town
- hall. Ms. Ricker asked if the BOS would like the construction company to look at the community
- center. Mr. Morin said the bill is the school's for someone look at the community center or the
- old town hall.
- 177 There was discussion about three trees on the old town hall property that may need to be
- 178 removed.
- 179 Other
- 180 Mr. Rosborough asked what needs to be done for Mooers Road to bring it up to standards. Mr.
- Bartlett said he would refer that to Shawn McLean. Ms. Danis said Mr. McLean needs to discuss
- that with the Board.
- Mr. Bartlett said he believes that stipulation for Mooers Road should be removed.
- Mr. Rosborough said Mooers Road is in good shape. He needs to know what the road needs to
- do to be officially accepted.
- Mr. Bassett said he owns Lamprey Road. He passed out a document to the BOS. He would like
- the Board to establish what has been maintained. He is asking if Lamprey Road is dedicated or
- not. If it hasn't been done, it needs to be done.
- Mr. Morin said this is something they should be asking the attorney. There are sections that were
- not maintained by the town before and can they be described as driveways then.
