Mammals included: Beaver in river

Invertebrates:

Mites on a leaf,

One of 7 species of dragonfly included - Common Basketail, Epitheca cynosura One of the most significant discoveries was a cocoon of a Giant Silk Moth.(*Callosamia promethean*).

Plants: invasive- lots of oriental bittersweet,

native green briar also is prevalent along trail

Native plants of interest-

Native- wide variety of ferns- bracken, royal, New York, Lady, Hay scented, Cinnamon, Interrupted

The group visited the memorial bench and noted it was in a perfect location over looking the river.

At approximately 5:45 pm the walk was completed.
