The hearing on the proposed variance is with the Zoning Board of Adjustment on May 18. The continuance of this case will be heard by the Planning Board on Wednesday, May 26.

Yes the Conservation Commission and Planning Board are aware that the proposed watercross site is located on an aquifer. There are regulations in place to address this. There are additional sensitive issues such as noise and potential impacts to the Pawtuckaway River, a NH Protected River, over which traffic will pass entering and leaving the site. The Commission has "voiced" these concerns with the PB.

Sam, Susan,

Please advise if you are aware of the proposed variance on the Nottingham Sand and gravel pit for the Water Cross events. The meeting is set for May 18th.

This property sits in the middle of the Aquifer Protection District.

The events are on very permeable soil - sand and gravel The events and pollution over time could poison a good number of private wells.

Making a permanent home for a race track type event would make a significant risk to the water table that leads to a protected River and watershed.

Over just one weekend, 100 riders will use 250 gallons of fuel and oil.

These two stroke engines will discharge between 15% and 25% of unused gas and oil into the water, soil and air. Over one year this amounts to an estimated 120 - 200 gallons of unspent fuel...

It only takes 1 gallon of gasoline to pollute 750,000 gallons of water.

Please weigh in on this issue.

Prevention is more suitable then cleanup of polluted soil.

Please DO NOT ASSUME that the DES will take care of this. they are like policemen, then will only come in after the damage is done.
