Nottingham Community Newsletter: The Last Issue?

At the March 1999 Annual Town Meeting a warrant article was passed to fund the printing and mailing of a community newsletter to all town residents. Its intent was to bring the community closer together by providing residents with news and information on what's happening in town, including events and items of interest from town and community organizations.

The first issue, Vol. 1 Issue 1 was mailed out and dated May–June 1999. A group of volunteers produced that issue. Over time the group members changed and varied, but the goal was always to produce an informative, non-biased newsletter for all town residents. There were a few missed issues over the years, but since the first one, the newsletter was very consistently produced six times a year, and mailed out. Most of the back issues are still available for inspection at the Nottingham Historical Society.

As you know, the Town of Nottingham NH budget did not pass this year. Consequently, there is no funding to continue printing and mailing the Nottingham Community Newsletter after this issue.

The current volunteers are hopeful that perhaps it will only be a temporary lull. We are hoping that funding for continuation, printing, and mailing will be possible, perhaps in next year's budget or a warrant article next spring. Thank you to all the readers who have supported our efforts and many others who have submitted articles and/or advertising over the years.

Town Clerk's Office Reminders and Information

Dog Licensing: Per state law, all dogs in NH must be licensed by April 30th each year. Registrations can be completed <u>online</u>, through the mail, or in person during regular office hours. The fee schedule is: \$7.50 for puppies and spayed/neutered dogs, \$10 for all others @ \$10 each.

Senior citizens pay only \$3 for the first dog.

Group licenses are available for 6 or more dogs @ \$26. If you wish to register your dog(s) by mail, include a check for the appropriate amount, a current rabies

certificate and the spay/neuter certificate (if appropriate), and a stamped, return envelope with \$1.00 postage to the Town Clerk We will mail the tag, license and paperwork back to you.

Late fees start accruing after June 1st, and a \$25 civil forfeiture fee will be applied for any dog not registered after July 1st. If you no longer have a previously licensed dog, please, contact our office at 603-679-5958 or by email at: landerson@nottingham-nh.gov to let us know.

Boats: You may register your boats, either new or renewals, in the Town Clerk's office. There will be a \$5 fee added for each boat registered. This must be done in person, as they cannot be renewed online, at this time.

Appointments: We encourage you to make an appointment before visiting our office. We have found that our customers appreciate the short wait times and privacy they receive while we process their transactions. If you would like to renew a number of vehicles, please choose the New Registration option to make your appointment.

In November you will have the opportunity to vote for the next president, two congressmen along with the state governor, a state senator and three state representatives. Now is the time to become an informed





Fire Prevention Basics

May cleanup and summer picnic season is upon us. With that comes a variety of questions about burning yard debris,

having campfires for toasting marshmallows, and gathering around to sing and tell ghost stories. Here is some of what we learned from talking with a Nottingham Fire Department deputy. It answers some commonly asked questions and provides information about some local and state regulations governing fires and fire safety.

A permit to kindle a fire is always needed except when the area within a 100-foot radius from the edge of the fire is covered with at least an inch of snow or other frozen precipitation to prevent the combustion of woodland fuels. In some cases, when there is sustained precipitation, a permit may not be required. More on this later! It is also not legal to build bonfires on the frozen surface of a lake, stream, or river.

At no time can you burn trash, or treated, painted, stained, or manufactured wood. No brush, lumber, logs, or any other combustible material larger than 5 inches in diameter is permitted to be burned. Construction or demolition materials cannot be burned.

If you want to obtain a permit, you can go to the Nottingham Fire Station (free) or complete one online (\$6.00) at NHFirePermit.com. You will need to indicate what category fire you want the permit for.

Category I: small, controlled fire such as a camp or cooking fire no greater than 2 feet in diameter. It needs to be contained within a ring of fire-resistant material or a portable fireplace and located at least 25 feet from structures. Fire conditions permitting, a Category I fire can be kindled with a permit any time of day.

Category II: controlled fire no larger than 4 feet in diameter contained within a ring of fire-resistant material or a portable fireplace and located at least 50 feet from structures. These fires may be kindled with a permit only between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. unless it is actually raining. If the rain stops, the fire must be extinguished.

Category I and II permits are seasonal and expire on December 31st.

Category III: any other fire that is not a Category I or II or a fire greater than 4 feet in diameter or not contained within a ring of fire-resistant material and located at least 50 feet from any structures. These fires may be kindled with a permit (only) between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. unless it is actually raining. Category III permits may be issued for up to 7 days.

Summary

Category I (seasonal): Daytime Burn Between 9:00 a.m. & 5:00 p.m.and Nighttime Burn Between 5:00 p.m. & 9:00 a.m. is OK.

Category II (seasonal) Daytime Burn Between 9:00 a.m. & 5:00 p.m.: Only when raining. Nighttime Burn Between 5:00 p.m. & 9:00 a.m. is OK.

Category III (For up to 7 days) Daytime Burn Between 9:00 a.m. & 5:00 p.m.: Only when raining. Nighttime Burn Between 5:00 p.m. & 9:00 a.m. is OK.

When requesting a permit, you need to establish that the fire will be kindled on your land. If you are renting, you must also have the written permission of the homeowner to kindle a fire on their property. If you are part of a HOA, the HOA must provide written permission.

You must attend the fire until it is completely extinguished. A buried fire is not considered extinguished. If a fire escapes from control, you may be held liable for payment of property damage, payment of the cost of putting out the fire, and face prosecution for failure to comply with regulations.

The NH State Parks have their own specific regulations regarding building fires.


In this issue, our community spotlight shines on...

Samuel Demeritt

When asked where he grew up and

how he ended up in Nottingham, Sam reported that he spent his childhood years in Candia, NH. After that, between February 1961 to February 1964, he served in the US Army repairing radars in an ordnance detachment attached to an antiaircraft missile battalion in Key West Florida.

After his tour in the military, Sam got a job with Sprague Electric in Concord



Sam has contributed much to our community. He served for many years on the local Cub Scout and Boy Scout committees including a term as the Cub Scout Committee Chair. In the 1970s, Sam volunteered to represent his local fish and game club as a delegate to the New Hampshire Wildlife Federation. He eventually became vice president and then president with a second term in the 1990s The NHWF Executive Director spoke to the board about the importance of joining local conservation commissions if they were concerned about conservation. Shortly after that, an article appeared in the Nottingham Community Newsletter stating that the Nottingham Conservation Commission had several vacancies. He attended the next meeting, volunteered to serve, and was appointed by the Board of Selectmen shortly thereafter. Sam has served on the Conservation Commission for around 25 years, including some years as co-chair and as chair. Sam is currently the chair and extremely involved in local conservation activities which include site walks, roadside cleanup, and monitoring properties with conservation easements.

One of the things Sam loves best about Nottingham is the feeling of living in the country and seeing all the wildlife. That includes the 18 turkeys that wander through his yard.

Lake Hosts Protecting Pawtuckaway Lake

Traveling west on Deerfield Road, about 2 miles from Nottingham Square, you will see a small sign on the



right side of the road with a symbol of a boat. Across from that sign is a nondescript dirt road at the end of which is a parking lot. On most summer days, that lot is filled to overflowing with vehicles having racks or boat trailers. This is the Fundy Boat Launch, the only public boat launch

on Pawtuckaway Lake outside of the State Park.

Pawtuckaway Lake is a very popular lake for boating, with an average of 35 fishing tournaments every



summer and a huge amount of transient boating traffic, both motorized and nonmotorized. Despite its modest appearance, the Fundy boat launch is one of the most heavily used boat

launches in the whole state of New Hampshire. This makes it a prime location for the unintended introduction of invasive plants and animals into the

lake. For continued health of the lake, it important that boaters be educated the about introduction of nonnative species as well



as trying to insure that there are no unintended "hitchhikers" on their boats or trailers. For the



protection of the lake, both paid and volunteer Lake Hosts are stationed at the Fundy launch to provide voluntary inspections of watercraft that are entering and leaving the lake.

While Lake Hosts are not able to be there 24/7, they are present during the busier days and times to try to educate boaters and inspect as many boats and trailers as possible. During a typical summer, the Lake Hosts at Fundy will perform about 11,000 inspections, the most of any Lake Host program in New Hampshire! In 2023 the Lake Host program cost \$23,706 and ran from May to October. The Pawtuckaway Lake Improvement Association's (PLIA's) Lake Host Program is administered through NH LAKES with the funding provided from several sources. In 2023, the Town of Nottingham contributed \$5000 of that total. The PLIA contributed \$13,476 with the remainder coming from NH DES. Volunteers also contributed 118 hours to inspect boats and trailers at the Fundy launch and at the State Park. While the Lake Host program is a significant

every time they find an invasive plant or animal, it pays itsel



many times over in the time and expense that would be required to eradicate or control an invasive once it gets established in the lake.

As an example, variable milfoil was introduced into Pawtuckaway Lake around 2014 by a boater, but probably not through the Fundy launch. So far that introduction and the subsequent establishment of milfoil in many areas of the lake has consumed over 4500 hours of volunteer searching time and over \$50,000 just to contain - not eradicate - this threat. It is unlikely that we will ever be able to eliminate milfoil entirely, so the volunteer time and related expenses will have to be



incurred for the foreseeable future. Variable milfoil is just one of many increasing threats from non-native species facing NH lakes, so the work of the Lake Hosts inspecting watercraft and educating the public is money well invested.
