Planning Board Update

The Planning Board currently has a vacant member position to be filled until the March town elections. In addition, the Board is also seeking alternates to participate in meetings and fill member positions when needed. If you are interested in filling the member role until March or serving as an alternate to the Board, please fill out a volunteer application (located on the town website or at the town offices) and submit it to the Planning Board or Town Administrator's office. The Planning Board meets the second and fourth Wednesday of the month at 7 pm unless otherwise posted.

As of the deadline of this newsletter, December 1, 2023, the Planning Board currently has two continued cases to be heard on December 13th. The first is for a 25-lot open space development (OSD) subdivision on 102.77 acres off Smoke Street and Fort Hill Road. This case has been ongoing since April. The second case is for a 2-lot residential subdivision on White's Grove Road. This case was first heard on November 8th. Please visit the town website Planning Department for more details and updates on both cases.

Just a reminder, the Planning Board does not only review cases for new subdivisions in town. They also provide conceptual consultations for land use and businesses who are seeking guidance before submitting official subdivision or site review applications. This is a service that the Board provides free of charge.

Walkers, Waddlers, Hoppers, and Bounders: Animal Tracking Hike, February 24, 2024

An Animal Tracking and Winter Hike Hosted by the Nottingham Conservation Commission and Trails Committees

The winter season is a great time for being outdoors and exploring the local woods. Many mammals and birds are active during the winter months, such as bobcats, coyotes, deer, foxes, rabbits, squirrels, chickadees, jays, turkeys, and woodpeckers.

Join the Nottingham Conservation Commission and the Nottingham Trails Committee for an animal tracking, signs, and sounds hike through fields and forests: Animal Tracking Winter Hike, Terninko Conservation Area (Case Road), Saturday, February 24, at 10:00 AM.

The hike will be led by Nottingham resident Kristen Lamb. Kristen is an environmental educator and the Executive Director at Center for Wildlife located in Cape Neddick, Maine. https://www.thecenterforwildlife.org

The Terninko Conservation Area in Nottingham is located on Case Road at the intersection with Oak Ridge Road. If there is no snow or a storm on February 24, the hike will occur on Saturday, March 2, at 10:00 AM. Steady rain/snow or icy trail conditions will cancel the event.

During the hike, you will learn about common tracking terms and movements patterns. For example, mammals have four primary ways of walking and running:


- Walkers have a straight trail pattern, such as dogs, cats, deer, moose, and hoofed animals.
- Waddlers have an alternating pattern, such as beaver, muskrat, opossum, porcupine, raccoon, and skunk.
- Hoppers jump by pushing off with hind feet, landing on front feet, and then swinging back feet to the front again for another jump, including chipmunk, mouse, rabbit, squirrel, and vole.

Below, squirrels are hoppers that have a *U-shaped footprint pattern:*



• Bounders push off with hind feet, land on front feet, and then swing their back feet into the front tracks, such as bear, bobcat, fisher, mink, otter, and weasel.

On the right, fishers are bounders that have an arc pattern between the toes and toe pads:




