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- On Tuesday, June 8, 2021, the Town of Nottingham held its Town Election Day and residents voted in favor of Warrant Article #19. See: Exhibit #2.
- 4. At the Town Meeting, earlier in 2020, the residents voted on a warrant article that accepted Highland Road as a class V highway.
- Thereby, the eighteen (18) Camp Roads in the Complaint are now "town roads", or Class V roads.
- As a result, the plaintiffs, hereby, wish to withdraw the present action by way of a nonsuit, without prejudice.
